The second session was presided by Lutfu Hanum Selima Begum, eminent poet. The discussant was Nilim Kumar.

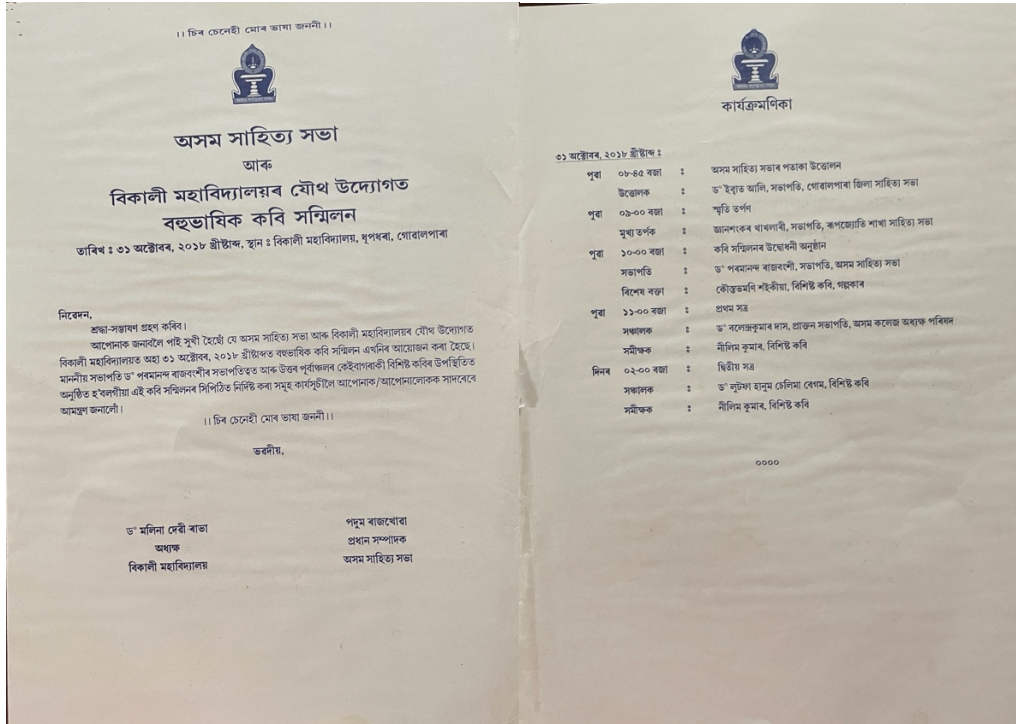


Figure 1 Conference Brochure

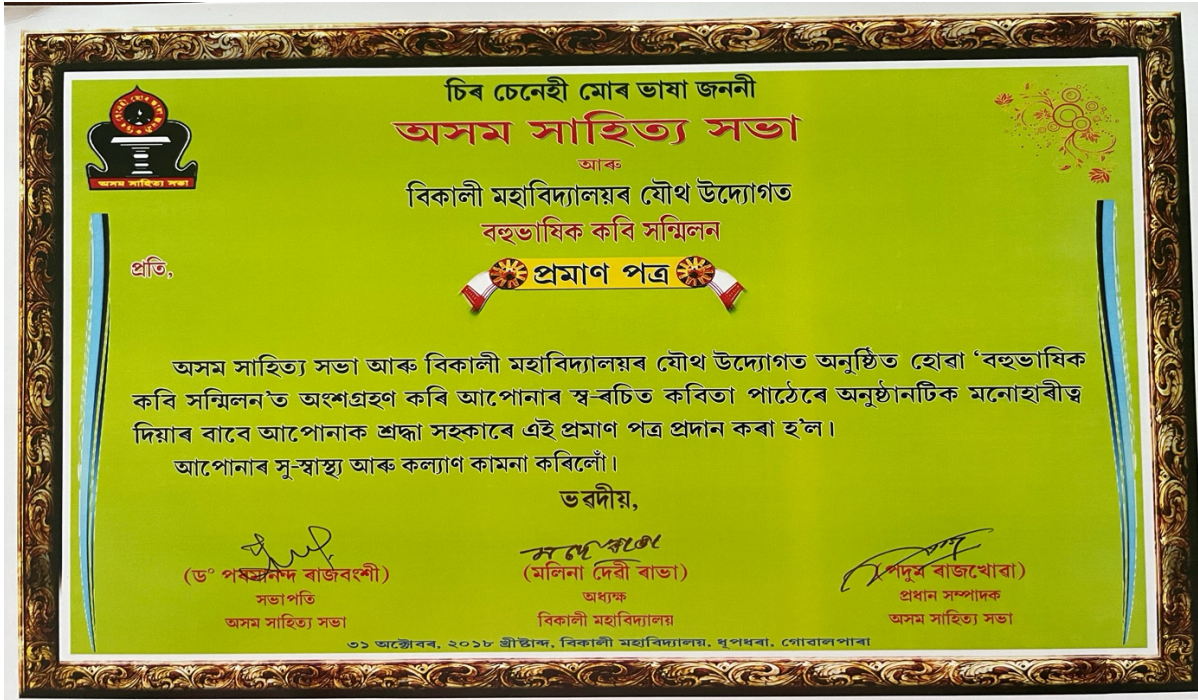


Figure 5 Certificate presented to participants

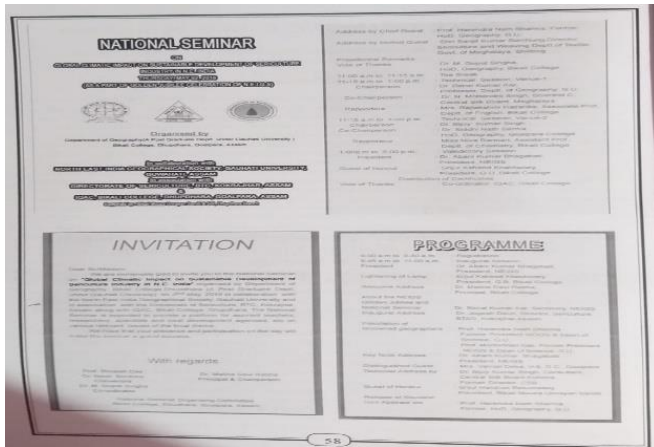

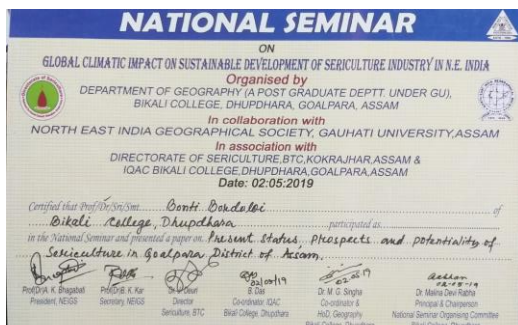



**Workshop on English as a Language of Communication
Organised by Department of English**

June 21, 2019

English as a language of communication has always been a challenge for students of vernacular medium especially in the rural areas. Looking into the problem the department of English decided to organize a workshop on English as a Language of Communication on June 21, 2019. The main objectives were

- a. To remove the fear for communicating in English language
- b. To make the students learn the techniques of improving their communicative skills
- c. To build up the confidence of students

As per the decision of the department, Dr.Anup Kumar Deka, Assistant Professor, Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia College, Guwahati was invited as the resource person for the workshop on English as a Language of Communication.
