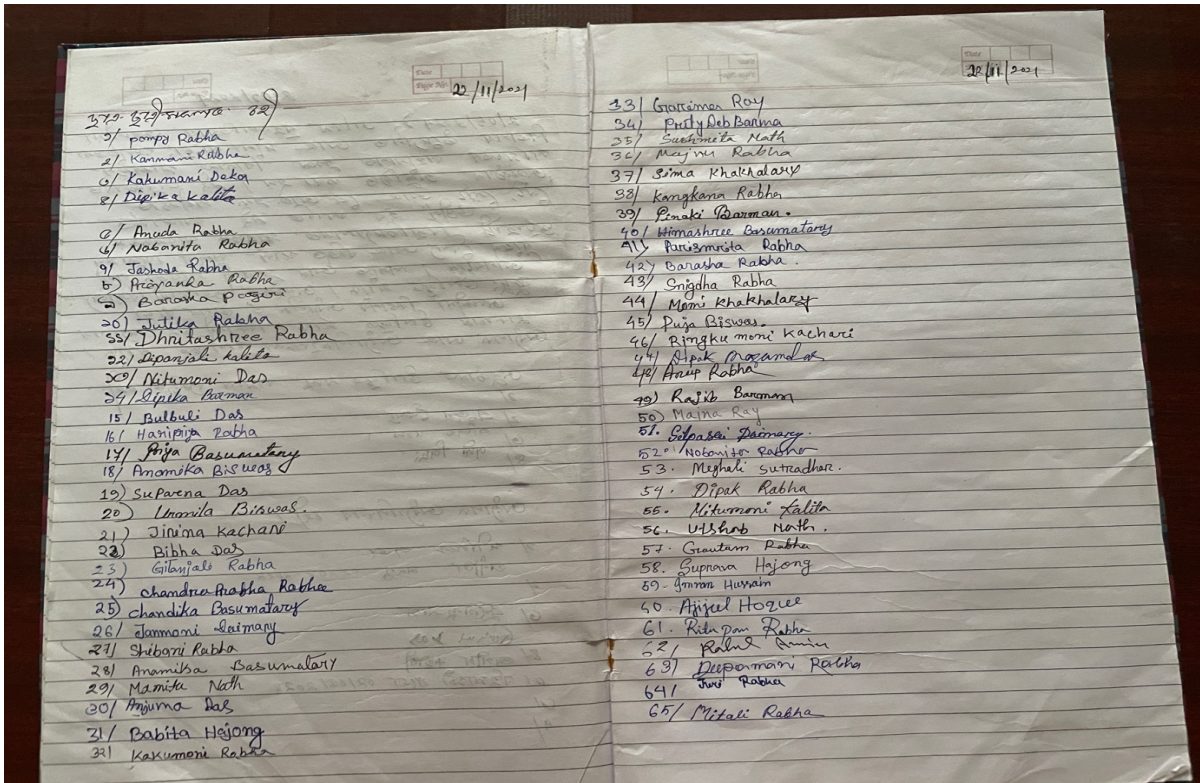


Figure 4 Attendance Sheet of the Modern Song Workshop

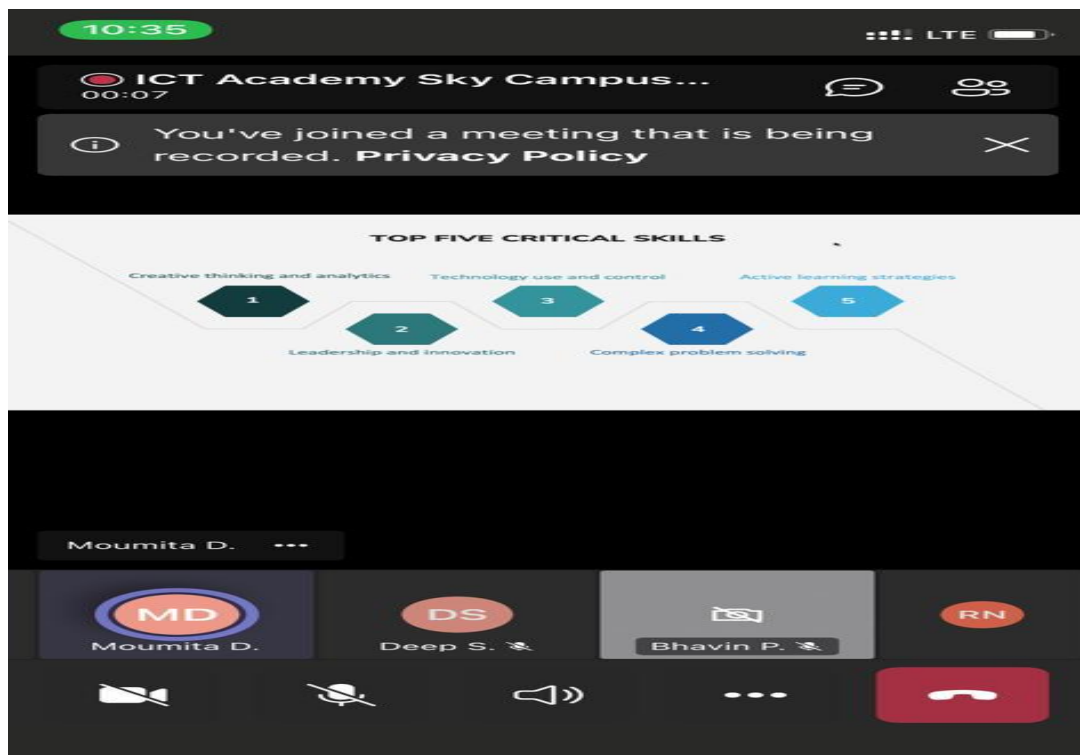


Figure 9 Several students joined through Google Meet on their phones

A webinar was held by the Department of English, on 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2021. Dr.Monalisha Roychaudhury was the coordinator of the programme. The webinar was inaugurated by Dr. Monoj Gogoi, Principal, Bikali College and in his inaugural speech he briefly talked about the importance of writing and reading literature.

The objective of the webinar was to discuss about that class of society who usually are not mentioned in literature for various reasons. The resource person Dr.Daimari gave a glimpse of how the woman writer (poet) did not find a place in Dr Samuel Johnson's seminal work 'Lives of Poets'. Even when we look at other works written by various writers, women, children, prisoners, those belonging to the lower social strata (the sex- worker, the housemaid , the rag picker, the bus driver, the transgender, queer) are missing or voiceless. Social topics of the sub-continent like child marriage, dowry torture, victims of acid attacks are never mentioned. There may be many reasons as to their absence. Mainly, arises the problem of articulation. The power to describe, to tell a story in a particular manner or use of language to make what is told attractive to the reader acts as a barrier. Then again, they face the politics of what gets published or who will published their writings. Baby Haldar's ' Life Less Ordinary', Nalini Jameela's ' The Autobiography of a Sex Worker', Urvashi Bhutalia's 'The other Side of Silence' to name a few works by women writers were mentioned. Other types of life writings can be Travelogues, memoirs, letters, prison diaries all fall under life narratives. A reading of them will give us better understanding of the person and his experience. Individual memory and collective memory have a very important role to play.

She ended the webinar by stating that much research is to be done and writing by the marginalized about their experiences is to be encouraged.

The webinar ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Prasanta Pathak, Assistant Professor of the department. Associate Professor Rajlakshmi Hazarika moderated the webinar.

The webinar was attended by Professors of Bikali College, scholars of Gauhati University, Dudhnoi College, and students of English Department including students from other departments of Bikali College. Participants numbered to 70 in number.

Gandhi answered with a counter-question, "Sikhs may remain as such in perpetuity, so may Moham-medans, so may Europeans. Will un-touchables remain untouchables in perpetuity?" (cw 48: 298).

At the London Conference

Gandhi said before the Minorities Committee of the RRC that "he would not sell the vital interests of the un-touchables even for the sake of winning the freedom of India." He claimed (on 13 November 1931) that those demanding the separate electorate "do not know their India, do not know how Indian society is today constructed" (cw 48: 297-98).

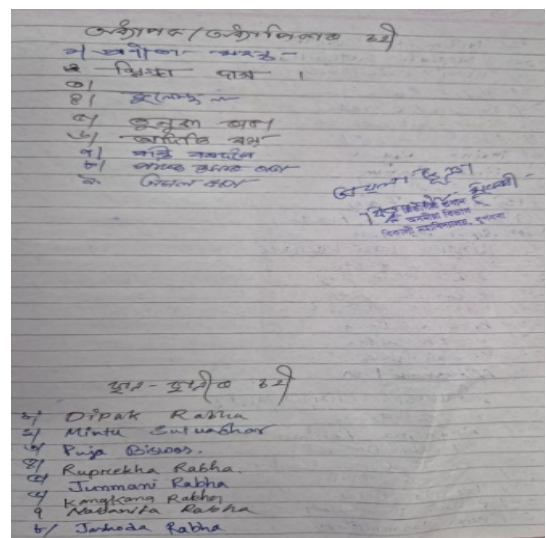
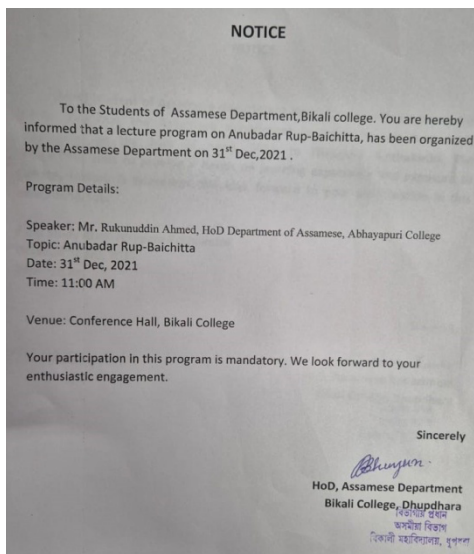

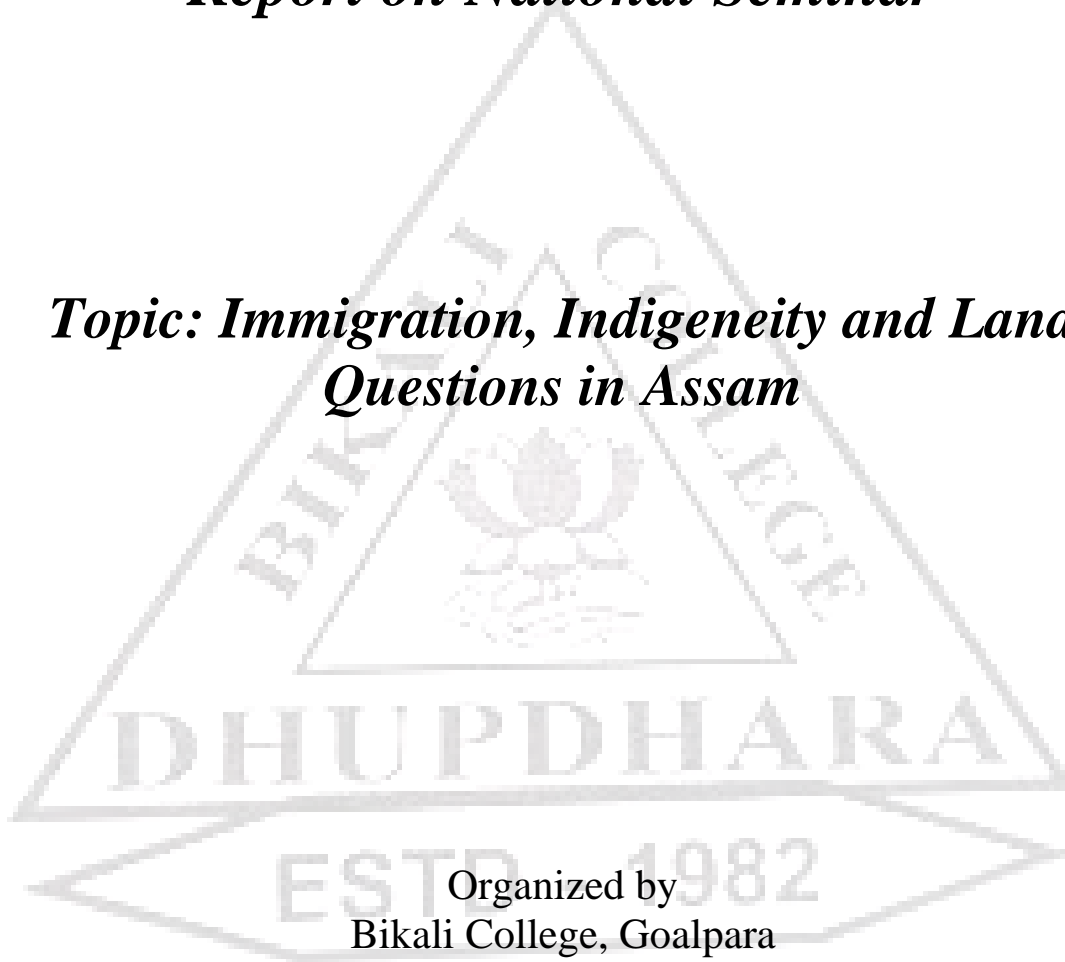

#### Concept Note:

In Assam, the Land question has continued to occupy the central stage of politics and shaped political discussions and debates for a long time. The existing system of land ownership and tenancy, as claimed by many analysts, has lacked proper policies. From historical perspectives, this problem is seen to be linked to the immigrations in Assam since colonial times. Two waves of immigrations acutely appeared in colonial period – one was the immigration in form of plantation labourers for the British tea gardens and the other was the East Bengal Immigrant peasants who were settled by the British administrators in the initial stage and later by the provincial governments under the leadership of Md. Saddulla. The flow of immigration from East Bengal, however, continued for quite a long time despite occasional local repercussions against it. Though the actual numbers are debatable, it is widely believed that a large number of immigrants have settled in Assam in the post-colonial period which had several repercussions – whether in form of Assam movements or initiation of NRC process.

While other immigrant groups are accepted in as 'indigenous' inhabitant of Assam by majority groups, the East Bengal Immigrants are not popularly seen as the 'indigenous' group of Assam. Though the definition of 'indigenous Assamese', is debatable, it is now widely accepted that East Bengal Immigrants cannot be accepted as 'indigenous' people. Premier student organization like All Assam Student Union have been pushing that the Assam should

have the 'hegemony' of the 'indigenous'. Of late, the Government of Assam has also put considerable emphasis on the land right to the 'indigenous' population of Assam.

At this juncture, it is important to revisit the land questions of Assam on a historical background. This seminar is an attempt to re-examine the entire process of land rights of the people of Assam which started changing with the intervention of the British rule and have not been addressed well enough under the 'indigenous' Governments in the post-colonial era.
