

Overall Report of Academic and Administrative Audit Report Committee

An academic and administrative audit was conducted to review the mechanisms of Bikali College for monitoringand strengthening the academic quality and standards. A three-member external committee from peer institutions and various disciplines reviewed the departments and expressed their views.

The Principal of Bikali College has done a commendable job in facilitating the entire process and the work put in by all departments is highly appreciated by the Principal. The Heads of the

departments, IQAC coordinators and staff were requested to implement the suggestions of the experts in their respective departments. This academic exercise was an immense help and a fruitful endeavour to ensure effective implementation of the curriculum, and improve teaching, learning and evaluation methodologies.


The curriculum implementation of all programmes has been designed to ensure effective delivery. Efforts to enrich the curriculum through certificate and add-on courses are commendable. The college also has been making concerted efforts towards multidisciplinary learning and skill-based learning through regular seminars, workshops, invited lectures and trainings. The outcome-based paradigm is followed by the college in implementation of the curriculum.

Bikali College offersprogrammes from UG to PG levels and has all three streams-Arts, Science and Commerce, the latter two self-financed as well as the PG courses. The college has 53 full-time teaching staffand 1490 students for the current academic year. The teacher-student ratio stands at a 1:28 ratio. The laboratories are equipped with adequate facilities. The computer lab is a state-of-the-art facility. However, it is to be added that there is room for improvement, especially in the Science labs. The college has facilities for differently-abled students such as wheelchairs, ramps, scribes and disabled-friendly toilets. The central library has 26,700 textbooks and reference books, journals,videos, access to e-resources, digital library with Learning Management System (LMS), OPAC and E-content resources. The library has good collection of rarebooksand manuscripts.

Infrastructure for sports includes a field for variousgames (Football, Cricket, Hockey, Handball, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Kabaddi,etc.), a multi-purpose sports utility facility.

The college promotes various extra-curricular activities through organised units such as NCC, NSS, Extension Cell etc. These units train students in leadership roles and promote a sense of social responsibility. It is mandatory for hostel students to participate in Nature Club activities. Bikali College is also recipient of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan project and is actively involved in various extension and outreach activities among the adopted villages under the scheme. The college actively participated in vaccination camps during the pandemic. Staff are also actively involved in SVEEP activities to create voter awareness.

Strengths:

- Healthy combination of experienced and new dynamic faculty members in the Arts stream.
- Self-financed HS and UG courses in Science and Commerce and PG courses in Assamese and Geography which have been running successfully with the aid of civil society organisations.
- Good environment and scope for interdisciplinary learning which is well suited for implementation of NEP-based curriculum.
- Curriculum enrichment is done with Add-on courses, certificate courses, MOOCs and skill- based training and orientations.
- A good number of students from outside the state (Meghalaya) are enrolled in the college.
- ICT Based Course Plan and ICT Based Logbook are good practices adopted by the college
- The overall pass percentage of the college is satisfactory with more than 80% pass percentage. The science stream has recorded a 100% pass percentage during the assessment period.
- Adequatenumber of extension and outreach activities in the neighbourhood which has built good rapport and communication with the local society.
- The central and digital library is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities with good collection of books and manuscripts.

Weaknesses:

- · Resource mobilization for research and projects is weak.
- Science and Commerce streams are yet to be provincialized hampering the flow of resources and quality assurance.
- There is less enrolment in the Science and Commerce streams.
- Lesser number of faculty with PhDs and research experience.
- Socio-economic backwardness of the area leading to higher dropouts despite freeship and scholarships.
- No sanctioned posts for hostel staff, laboratories, sanitation, night-watchman increasing the financial burden of the institution
- There is a lack of placement cell in the institution.
- Lack of a startup or incubation centre.

Opportunities:

- Scope for collaboration with industry, state placement cells and units for internships and conduct placement drives.
- The district provides a huge opportunity for research and area studies.
- Integration of ICT brings greater opportunities for incorporating newer and advanced technology in teaching, learning such as MOOCs, and virtual labs.
- New courses can be developed and offered expanding into emerging fields while also
 ensuring that they are in tune with the needs of the region.
- There is scope for partnership with international and overseas institutions and organisations and to attract international students.
- Opportunities are present to access more grants, sponsorships, and endowments for the development of the college.
- The campus location and its green locale also provide a huge opportunity to become a model for green practices.
- With an ever-increasing number of female students as well as higher number women in the workforce, there is scope for the college to become a model for gender equity, safety and security.

Challenges:

- There is increasing competition from other colleges in the locality especially with regards to the Science and Commerce streams.
- Socio-economic backwardness of the area poses a threat to enrolment and the risk of higher dropouts.
- Loss in academic sessions due to a variety of reasons such as seasonal festivals, and non-academic duties.
- Area-based issues such as human-elephant conflict, and inadequate roadways especially in the interior areas from which the students hail, pose a challenge to the academic progress.
- Keeping up with and responding to a rapidly changing scenario especially in the postpandemic period has been a challenge.
- Technological changes have also brought threats such as cyber security threats, IPR and data privacy concerns.
- Procedural formalities delay and sometimes hinder innovation.

Recommendations:

- An action plan for the implementation of the NEP needs to be prepared fostering a more inclusive, innovative and flexible higher education system.
- The college website interface can be made to be more user-friendly.
- College should endeavour to recruit more full-time faculty members to improve the teacher-student ratio.
- College should recruit more non-teaching staff and provide them with professional training.
- Internships should be introduced to enhance experiential and hands-on learning.
- Feedback should be collected from more stakeholders.
- Strategies for slow and fast learners should be devolved and implemented in a more systematic manner.
- More e-contents need to be prepared and added to the LMS.
- Research and innovation environment needs to be strengthened.
- Resource mobilization especially for research and projects needs to be strengthened.
- More faculty members should be encouraged to enroll and complete PhD.
- Faculty members should be encouraged to take membership in professional bodies
- MOUs with industry to be created to create scope for training, internships and placements.
- A placement cell needs to be established.
- · IIC needs to be made functional.
- · Alumni Association needs to be registered and records to be maintained properly.
- Language Lab needs to be resumed.
- Students' progression to higher education needs to be improved.
- Regular FDPs to be conducted for the benefit of all faculty members.
